In addition, Kindergarten will focus on the following:

- Math—Writing numbers one to twenty, quantity in sets (least and most), left and right, addition and subtraction story problems, information processing.
- Reading—one and two vowel readers, story comprehension, writing our own stories, parts of a story (setting, characters, plot).
- Science – In depth study of the body systems and functions (respiratory, skeletal, muscular, cardiovascular, nervous system) and the five senses.

Extra-Curricular Classes

Dance Instructor, Miss Tina:

Dance class is moving right along and our little dancers are doing great. During tap class, we have been working on the basics such as heels and toes as well as learning how to tap in rhythm with the music. We also have completed our first dance routine to “If You Are Happy and You Know It”! In ballet, we are introducing the five basic positions and working on our balance.

Yoga Instructor, Miss Danielle:

We have been focusing on the importance of breath and posture in all our poses. I also introduced alphabet poses for letters A through J. My little yogis and I have had a wonderful time incorporated games, songs and stories into each class as well.

Cooking Instructor, Miss Cynthia:

To start our year, we’ve introduced some fun recipes to get our new students enthusiastic about cooking class and our returning students excited about new recipes. We’ve gone over basic cooking safety and rules while practicing our measuring, mixing, pouring and mashing skills that even our littlest chefs are mastering. Classes have been a delight and the children arrive to class eager to participate. We are looking forward to creating some “boo-tiful” concoctions during the month of October.
